**Stevens Introduces New Inker Designed for More Coverage...and Less**

FORT WORTH, March 7, 2007 -- Stevens Technology, the 56-year-old printing press manufacturer based in Fort Worth, Texas, has announced the release of a new inking system.

Named the "MoreStore™ Inker," the system is designed to handle those complex ad designs that have heavy solids and knockouts plus 6-point type with serifs.

"You know, like you see in ads for automobiles and prescription drugs," said Steve Parker, director of business development at Stevens. By using four rollers that oscillate, ink is distributed more evenly to the plate than with conventional inkers, according to Parker. In addition, the ink fountain motor has a programmable speed curve that is adjustable from the unit or the main console. The oscillating rollers feature adjustable stroke capacity and come standard with Rilsan covering. The MoreStore™ inker system's large capacity means less ink needs to be added when running high coverage jobs such as direct mail. Since the new system uses less dampening solution while printing with greater control, it can achieve brighter colors and higher contrast.

This finite control also enables a printer to be more versatile in meeting today's demands, producing text work, full coverage inserts, and direct mail on the same press. The new inking system is UV and EB ready and will be an option on all new press systems from Stevens Technology.

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
